El Coro Vineyard Pinot Noir 2018 Petaluma Gap

WINEMAKER NOTES

Spanish for "The Chorus," El Coro lives up to its name, delivering a harmonious balance of ripeness and acidity. The combination of this site's location next to San Pablo Bay with the wind gusting from the Pacific Ocean, creates a cool climate that brings tension to the wine. The grapes are picked in small yellow bins and transported in a refrigerated truck to the winery. The fruit is sorted and fermented in open top, stainless steel tanks. The goal is to showcase the finesse and acidity from this site by managing the extraction rate. The wine spends 9 months in a combination of new and neutral French oak barrels.

ABOUT THE VINEYARD

El Coro Vineyard is farmed by the Keller family and located within the Petaluma Gap AVA, the premier gateway to the Sonoma Coast. The "Gap" is a wind gap that allows the Pacific winds and maritime fog to roar into the region. The vineyard is a 20-acre block planted on the highest point of the Keller estate at 500 feet of elevation. The vines are growing on clay loam soils and a gravelly volcanic subsoil.

Color	Medium ruby
On the nose	Perfectly ripe raspberry, Rainier cherry and cranberry mixed with notes of roses, potpourri and a touch of anise
On the palate	The red fruits take on more wild strawberry and tart cherry flavors, while the freshness of the fruit and long finish proclaims the classiness of this wine
Varietal	Pinot Noir
Fermentation	Stainless steel, open top fermentation tanks
Aging	9 months in French oak barrels, with 22% of them being new
